Striving for a Culture of Life

Language Development Starts in the

Womb Using non-invasive sensing technology to measure changes in fetal heart rate, researchers from the University of Kansas Medical Center found that babies in the womb can distinguish between two rhythmically different languages. A bilingual speaker made two recordings of a passage, one in English, and one in Japanese, which were played to the unborn babies.

They found that fetal heart rates changed when preborns heard the unfamiliar, rhythmically distinct language (Japanese) after having heard a passage of English speech. However, their heart rates did not change when they were presented with a second passage of English instead of a passage in Japanese. The researchers examined 24 women, who were on average eight months pregnant.

Utako Minai, associate professor of linguistics and the team leader on the study published in *NeuroReport*, said. "Fetuses can hear things, including speech, in the womb. These results suggest that language development may indeed start *in utero*. Fetuses are tuning their ears to the language they are going to acquire even before they are born, based on the speech signals available to them in utero. Pre-natal sensitivity to the rhythmic properties of language may provide children with one of the very first building blocks in acquiring language."

Nigerian Pro-life Leader Criticizes Melinda Gates' Push for African Population

Control Obianuju Ekeocha, a Nigerian-born biomedical scientist and the founder of Culture of Life Africa, a U.K.-based pro-life group, argued on BBC's *Sunday Morning Live* that the Gates Foundation's push for contraception in Africa might be "an insidious way of moving the agenda of population control" since in many African countries the "desired number of children is actually quite high."

Melinda Gates announced last week that the Gates Foundation will commit an additional \$375 million to family planning programs, including abortion. "When a woman has access to contraceptives, she tends to have fewer children. Families can devote more resources to each child's nutrition, health, and education, setting them up for a better future," Gates said.

"I'm sure Melinda Gates means well," Ekeocha began.

Never Lived? Jeanne Mancini, 45, is the president of the March for Life Education and Defense Fund, which hosts its annual march around the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. She previously worked at the Family Research Council and the Department of Health and Human Services.

"My family was a bit of a leftward-leaning Catholic family. I had an experience when I was in high school that was profound and life-changing for me, a retreat called **Youth Encounter**. I came away from it with a sense of mission. Which, in some ways, informs what I do now."

"After college, I went into the Jesuit Volunteer Corps and worked in a **youth crisis shelter** and in residential treatment homes with kids who had either been sexually abused or even had been molesters. We're talking deep, deep wounds. And I went through a whole kind of philosophical grappling: Would it have been better if these kids never lived? I came to the opposite perspective: Every life is a gift. Who am I to judge the value of this one's life or that one's? So that was very formative in my ultimate calling to pro-life work. I believe that **everybody has inherent human dignity, from conception to natural death. And each person has the right to live out their unique mission. I can't think of a more important social justice cause."**

Free Abortions, Even For Illegal Aliens

Oregon's legislature passed a bill in July that **requires** health insurance plans to cover the total cost of abortion services for all Oregon residents, including illegal aliens.

House Bill 3391, the Reproductive Health Equity Act, ensures that all Oregonians receive the full range of preventative reproductive health services they need at **zero out-of-pocket cost** – regardless of their income, citizenship status, gender identity, or type of insurance. It requires health insurance plans to cover a full range of contraceptive and preventative care without cost sharing, including STD screenings, certain cancer screenings, vasectomies, IUD insertion, and **abortion**.

The \$10 million bill also mandates that taxpayer dollars be used to "reimburse" low-income illegal aliens for the cost of contraception, abortion procedures and other "reproductive health services." The bill allows for patients to obtain insurance-covered abortions for pretty much any reason at any point, **including sex-selective abortions** and the termination of children with unwanted medical issues or special needs.

Fetus Pictures Being Shared on Facebook

Last year, the Doritos Super Bowl ad that showed an ultrasound picture of a baby carried by its mother was condemned by the pro-abortion group, NARAL, for "humanizing the fetus." It did just that. The humanizing effect is so powerful that some women report not feeling pregnant until they've seen the pictures.

Anti-women feminists such as Allison Benedikt also acknowledge the effects of this technology. In a 2012 *Salon* article, she lashed out at pregnant women who were



sharing pictures of their unborn babies on Facebook.

"The more women share these pictures, the harder it will be to deny that they are people." She was exactly right.

Similarly, in 2007, author Melody Rose's pro-abortion book decries the way "recent developments in imaging technique certainly have facilitated a reliance on powerful pictures that humanize the fetus in a way not possible two decades ago."

In 1994, the great English historian Paul Johnson, author of *Modern Times*, **compared abortion to slavery**. He said the advances in medical technology have had a dramatic effect. "The fetus is being humanized," he said, "just as the slave was humanized." That's what worries NARAL.

What's So Bad About Planned Parenthood?

- Planned Parenthood is willing to cover up child rape and sex trafficking. It regularly instructs underage girls to lie on medical documents to avoid having to report statutory rape.
- It provides "sex-selection abortion" if a developing baby is the 'wrong' sex. This is called **gendercide**.
- PP does not offer mammograms and provides less than 2% of the nation's cancer screenings. Its CEO admitted under oath to Congress that she lied in claiming that women depend on her company for mammograms.
- Prenatal services are virtually nonexistent in almost all their facilities. Their ultrasound machines are used to help abortionists locate the preborn child prior to its destruction.
- PP does over 30% of the nation's abortions.
- It offers pizza parties and paid time off for workers who "sell" the most abortions.
- PP misdirects the public about the services it provides women in order to justify the \$540,000,000 it receives in **taxpayer funding** each year.

The preceding findings are based on investigations by undercover reporters in dozens of abortion centers, interviews of former abortion workers, and extensive research into Planned Parenthood's operations. These efforts are being spearheaded by *Live Action*, a non-profit organization dedicated to "defending the most vulnerable." Lila Rose, its president, says "abortion corrupts the soul and infects everything it touches—even a corporation as large and powerful as Planned Parenthood."

In one of its earliest investigations, Lila posed as a pregnant underage teen girl and entered eight PP facilities in six different states. She was **given advice that is illegal in all states**. As a result of these videoed reports, one state defunded Planned Parenthood, and others opened official criminal investigations.
